Ministry Description:

The internship is an eight (8) week fulltime (40 hour) intensive summer experience offering immersion with a multicultural urban parish and diocese. The intern will share to the fullest possible extent in the liturgical and ministerial life of the community. This shared life will include: regular preaching, pastoral care, Christian formation, and fellowship.

The intern's area of focus will be negotiated with site supervisor from the following:

*Pastoral care,
Family ministries,
Young adult ministries/Postmodern ministries,
New ministry/Community development,
Spirituality development,
Church re-growth,
Dynamics of leadership.*

Housing for one (1) and stipend are supplied (\$1500). Supporting and sponsoring diocese of selected intern will be asked to contribute \$1000 for internship. Assistance for travel to site negotiable. Personal office space and computer is supplied. Supervisor is willing to offer experience for academic credit. Interviews conducted electronically and by phone.

Parish Setting:

St Peter's Episcopal Church stands in the heart of downtown Honolulu, Hawai'i. Founded in 1886 as a storefront church for Chinese, Lutheran-convert laborers by the Church of England, we represent one of the oldest Chinese-American Episcopal churches. Members of the parish went on to found state hospitals in China, serve as US foreign consuls, distinguish themselves in military and government service, and establish churches across the Pacific Rim. St Peter's Church now lives the multicultural future of God's people together. Our community includes sixth generation Chinese, Hawaiians, young military families, professionals of varying backgrounds and ethnicities and recent immigrants – to name a few. Having experienced a community decline in the past 2 decades, the community has accepted God's call to reclaim our vital place and be catalysts for God's mission and transformation in Jesus Christ.

Honolulu, Hawai'i boasts the largest and most diverse geographic municipal area in the world. The only major US city not influenced primarily by Western European culture, we share in an amazing mixture and exposure of people, ethnicities, politics, and finances. Honolulu is the global crossroads of the Pacific.
