Pok-hui and I are blown away by the sincerity and depth of feeling expressed by comments to us as members of the SPEC family regarding our forthcoming move. We joined St. Peter's shortly after we arrived in Honolulu in 2005, following several months of visiting other Episcopal churches here. As you will recall, during the 2007- 2012 period SPEC endured several lengthy clergy-searches efforts. During this period SPEC had to rely on visiting or substitute priests, all of whom gave their best efforts. But, they weren't ours....



This experience would have destroyed most churches...but not SPEC. Its strong congregation kept the Church running until our hard working search committee struck "gold" and convinced Pastor Diane to accept our offer to take the reins and lead us to new heights, as signified by the church renovation project, jazz vespers, over-flowing coffee hours, etc/etc.

Separately, Pok-hui's selection as senior warden, vestry member, dinner-maker and other contributions, along with my efforts, has given us a deep, warm feeling to be part of SPEC.

### 2022 Pledge Report

Thank you for your generous support of the ministry of this church! We are in the midst of a strong pledge response. To date, we have 63 pledging units for a total of \$246,420.00. This is close to our pre-pandemic giving that we reached with 73 giving units. Thank you! If you haven't made a pledge for 2022 yet, it's not too late! We welcome your pledge. The pledging of the congregation guides the Vestry in its budget work. We will finish 2021 in strong position with a surplus thanks to the generosity of this congregation and the PPP and PPP2 monies we received. This is significant because we will need those additional funds in 2022 to cover rental income loss from our wedding company tenant that has not been able to resume operations due to the pandemic. They hope to be able to resume business again mid-year, but that will depend upon travel restrictions in Japan. This year's surplus and strong pledging will get us through 2022. By 2023, we will have a better sense of the degree to which the church can continue to rely upon rental income from this wedding company, a tenant that has been a significant part of the budget prior to the pandemic.

This past month St. Peter's knitting ministry gave lap robes to the Mililani Dialysis Clinic to keep patients warm while receiving treatments. Jennifer Kawamoto, St. Peter's member and nurse, wrote:
