On April 24th, Bishop Bob announced that the moratorium on public worship in the Episcopal Churches of this Diocese would continue until at least May 15th. While he continues to monitor the situation, he anticipates that the moratorium will remain in place on Oahu through the end of May. In the meantime, church has moved online! # **Quarantine Responses from Rev. Jazzy:**

What have you found yourself getting into while in quarantine? Some of you have been baking, some of you have been going on longer walks around the neighborhood, some of you have been providing childcare. . . this time apart from one another and learning to work remotely for many of us has been a challenge, but I haven't heard anyone say that they are bored!! So far I've learned to cook some new dishes, planted new seeds in the garden, and learned how to prune the orange tree. I even changed the handles on our kitchen cabinets! Perhaps one of the gifts of this time is the creativity that we can access, and the time freed in our schedules. One of the ways we have had to be creative is by utilizing technology for our worship together. One of you shared that you have been participating in our morning prayer broadcasts live from your yard, while your toddler runs around and adds his occasional, "Alleluia!", and, "Thanks be to God!"

During this time of physical separation I am still feeling close to many of you - and with daily morning prayer you're probably seeing more of me than ever before (and sometimes even before I brush my teeth, which I would never do in person!!) For me, this daily prayer ritual has been grounding, giving me a daily foundation in God's Word and in the community I am called to serve. I pray that we are able to see the gifts of this time, alongside the hardships of it.

Darrell Whitaker, the Executive Director of Camp Mokule'ia, announced that the Camp has made the difficult decision to cancel its 2020 Summer Camp program. The decision was reached after consultation with local health care professionals and considering information provided by the CDC, ACA (American Camp Association), Hawai'i Department of Health, and federal "Opening America Again" guidelines.

Families of campers who have already registered to participate in any of our 2020 Summer Camp programs are being contacted directly, and given the opportunity to either:

- Apply their balances to a future camp experience at Camp Mokule'ia,
- Donate all/part of their balance to the ministry of Camp Mokule'ia,
- Receive a full refund
